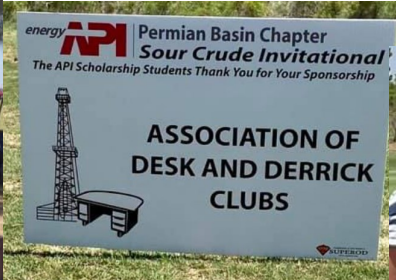
As you can see, it takes a village to make an event like this successful and once again our members showed up and gave 100% plus!

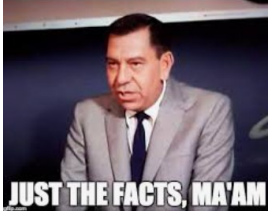
About me:

WANT TO KNOW ABOUT GEOTHERMAL

OVERVIEW

Geothermal resources are reservoirs of hot water that exist at varying temperatures and depths below the Earth's surface. Wells a mile or more deep can be drilled into underground reservoirs to tap steam and very hot water that can be brought to the surface for use in a variety of applications, including electricity generation, direct use and heating and cooling.

The ground is a good insulator and stores the heat as energy. Pipes are run through a large area several feet underground. Water is heated as it passes through these pipes. New drilling technologies are being researched and developed to capture the heat in deeper areas.

HOW GEOTHERMAL ENERGY IS FORMED

Magma (layers of melted rock from the Earth's crust) deep in the Earth's core heats nearby rock and rainwater that has seeped into the ground. Some of this hot water reaches the Earth's surface in the form of geysers or hot springs. Most stays trapped in porous rocks and cracks underground in geothermal reservoirs.

Geothermal specialists drill into these reservoirs to access the hot water and steam and use it to generate electricity at geothermal power plants. The heated water and steam produces enough power to spin turbine generators that make electricity.

Geothermal heat pumps use the Earth's relatively stable underground temperature to heat and cool buildings with very little energy use or environmental impact. The pumps, which use pipes buried next to buildings, circulate water or other liquids to either heat the buildings using energy from the Earth's crust or cool the buildings by pulling heat from them and transferring it to the Earth. This form of heating and cooling is used in the US, Sweden, Romania, Japan and other countries around the globe.

SOME ADDC FIRSTS

The first Club Meeting was held on March **1949** in New Orleans, Louisiana by Inez Awtry Shaeffer.

The first Articles of Association were signed on July 23, **1951**.

In **1952** Inez Awtry Shaeffer was presented with an ADDC Honorary Member. There have only been two presented in ADDC history, the second being Lee Wilson Hoover in 1954.

The first ADDC President was Lee Wilson Hoover elected in **1952**.

The first Convention was held in **1952** at the Shamrock Hotel in Houston, Texas. Forty clubs were represented with 994 registrants.

The first Oil and Gal Journal was published in **1952**. It was named by Josephine Nolen of Odessa, Texas, who won the contest for its name.

The first International Convention was in held September **1954** at the Banff Springs Hotel in Banff, Alberta, Canada.

The AIMEE (Achievement in Maintaining Energy Excellence) was first established in **1977**. The two levels are the Regional Award of Merit (Region Winners) and the Association's Award of Excellence (International Winners).

The first Desk and Derrick Journal was published in **1987**. It replaced the Oil and Gal Journal.

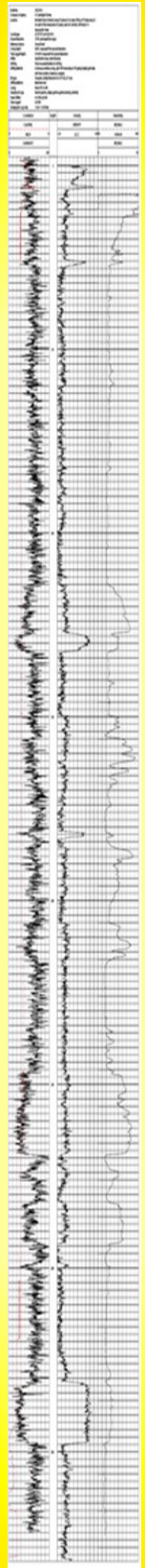
Membership first opened to men in **1988**.

In **2002** the curriculum was established for a Certification Program, the Petroleum Tech Certificate of Completion, to be given at the annual ADDC Convention.

In **2008**, the first Petroleum Tech Certificate of Completion was awarded; there were seven people who received this certification.

The first ADDC Insight replaced the Desk and Derrick Journal in **2014**. Helen Trujillo, of the Club of Farmington, was the original editor. The Insight is a link between Club members and ADDC, and is only available online.

Membership first opened to people not employed with an energy industry business in **2015**.

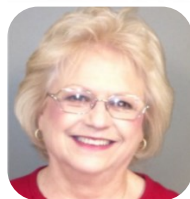
