



CLUB PROGRAM ARTICLE

Topic: An Overview of the Basics: Facilities, Pipelines, and Operations
Speaker: Shaun Guthrie, Facilities Engineering Specialist, EOG Resources, Inc.
June 10, 2021

For the June 2021 meeting, the club had the pleasure of having Mr. Shaun Guthrie with EOG Resources speak about the basic operations of production facilities from the wellhead to the facility, the design and placement location of the facility in relation to the well pads, as well as the use of pipelines to transport products to various markets.

Shaun first explained how oil, gas, and water are transported from the wellhead to the Horizontal Heated Separator (HHS) at the facility via a flowline unique to each well; product is separated out and then either sold into the gas, water, or oil gathering systems connected to the facility. Shaun also touched on why the flaring of natural gas occurs and some of the ways EOG is going the extra mile to prevent flaring episodes from occurring.

After describing the operations of production facilities, Shaun moved on to how pipelines carry the gas, water, and oil products to either high pressure gas compressor stations, salt water disposal wells or water reuse pits, and tank farms that house the oil before it is put on a rail car and transported to Oklahoma or the Gulf Coast.

Shaun's presented sparked a 30-minute Q&A session that promoted an understanding by all of those in attendance. On behalf of the Desk and Derrick Club of Midland, I would like to extend our gratitude to Shaun for volunteering to give his extremely informative presentation.


About me:



WANT TO KNOW ABOUT BIOMASS

energy4me.org

OVERVIEW

Biomass is organic material that comes from plants and animals, and it is a renewable source of energy. It contains stored energy from the sun. Plants absorb the sun's energy in a process called photosynthesis. When biomass is burned, the chemical energy in biomass is released as heat. Biomass can be burned directly or converted to liquid biofuels or biogas that can be burned as fuels.

Examples of biomass and their uses for energy

- Wood and wood processing wastes burned to heat buildings, to produce process heat in industry, and to generate electricity
- Agricultural crops and waste materials burned as a fuel or converted to liquid biofuels
- Food, yard, and wood waste in garbage burned to generate electricity in power plants or converted to biogas in landfills
- Animal manure and human sewage converted to biogas, which can be burned as a fuel

EDUCATION

SOME ADDC FIRSTS

The first Club Meeting was held on March 1949 in New Orleans, Louisiana by Inez Awtry Shaeffer.

The first Articles of Association were signed on July 23, 1951.

In **1952** Inez Awtry Shaeffer was presented with an ADDC Honorary Member. There have only been two presented in ADDC history, the second being Lee Wilson Hoover in 1954.

The first ADDC President was Lee Wilson Hoover elected in **1952**.

The first Convention was held in **1952** at the Shamrock Hotel in Houston, Texas. Forty clubs were represented with 994 registrants.

The first Oil and Gal Journal was published in **1952**. It was named by Josephine Nolen of Odessa, Texas, who won the contest for its name.

The first International Convention was in held September 1954 at the Banff Springs Hotel in Banff, Alberta, Canada.

The AIMEE (Achievement in Maintaining Energy Excellence) was first established in 1977. The two levels are the Regional Award of Merit (Region Winners) and the Association's Award of Excellence (International Winners).

The first Desk and Derrick Journal was published in **1987**. It replaced the Oil and Gal Journal.

Membership first opened to men in 1988.

In **2002** the curriculum was established for a Certification Program, the Petroleum Tech Certificate of Completion, to be given at the annual ADDC Convention.

In **2008**, the first Petroleum Tech Certificate of Completion was awarded; there were seven people who received this certification.

The first ADDC Insight replaced the Desk and Derrick Journal in **2014**. Helen Trujillo, of the Club of Farmington, was the original editor. The Insight is a link between Club members and ADDC, and is only available online.

Membership first opened to people not employed with an energy industry business in 2015.

Baton Rouge Capitol Park Museum and River Studies Center

<u>Cost: \$ 50.00/person</u> <u>Limited to 30 attendees</u> (Snacks and water on bus) (lunch at Pastime Restaurant – pay your own - separate checks)

You'll start the field trip with a tour of the LSU Center for River Studies. The center conducts research on the world's major rivers with a specific focus on the Mississippi River. They train the next generation of engineers, geologists and river experts. Located on the Baton Rouge Water Campus near the banks of the Mississippi River, it houses one of the world's largest movable bed physical models - the Lower Mississippi River Physical Model.

The river model is 10,000 square feet and based on the topography and bathymetry of the Mississippi River Delta covering southeast Louisiana. Pumps are used to control the water and sediment injection. More than 18 acoustic sensors coincide with U.S. Army Corps of Engineers river gages on the Mississippi River and measure water levels in the model river. Twenty high-definition projectors illuminate the model and bring the river and coast to life.

After the tour we'll take a short bus ride where you can enjoy lunch (pay for your own) at the Pastime Restaurant, which has been serving the Baton Rouge area for 75 years. Po-boys, seafood platters, pizza, burgers, and hot dogs –something for everyone at this local landmark eatery.

Next, you will tour the historic Capitol Park Museum where the special Smithsonian exhibit of The Green Book will be on display. From Louis Armstrong to Huey P. Long, from Mardi Gras to fais-do-do, and from the nation-building commerce of the Mississippi River to the life-sustaining bounty of the Gulf of Mexico, the Capitol Park Museum provides a panoramic exploration of the most vibrant state in America.

See how American Indians; colonists from France, Spain and Britain; enslaved Africans and Acadians from Nova Scotia—eventually known as Cajuns—populated and cultivated Louisiana, shaping it into one of the most culturally rich regions in the world. With thematic exhibits on diverse aspects of Louisiana history, industry and culture, the museum includes two permanent exhibits: Grounds for Greatness: Louisiana and the Nation and Experiencing Louisiana: Discovering the Soul of America.
