



ENERGY TRAVELS - EXPLORATION - Part 3 and 4 DRILLING

First, a surface well is drilled. Surface casing and cement are installed. After more drilling, intermediate casing and cement is set. Drilling continues to a pre-determined depth, then production casing and cement are installed.

During the drilling process, the well is logged and tested. Core and cutting samples are taken to gather data on underground formations.

COMPLETION

Several important operations, including perforation and stimulation, are done in this phase.

The production casing must be perforated to allow the oil or gas to flow from the target reservoir into the production tubing.

After perforation, the well is stimulated to encourage the oil or gas to flow from the reservoir into the wellbore. Hydraulic fracturing is the stimulation technology most often used when oil and gas are trapped in "unconventional" source rocks, such as shale.



WANT TO KNOW ABOUT NATURAL GAS energy4me.org

Natural gas is a fossil energy source that formed deep beneath the earth's surface. Millions years ago and over long periods, the remains of plants and animals built up in thick layers on the earth's surface and ocean floors, sometimes mixed with sand, silt and calcium carbonate. Over time, these layers were buried under sand, silt and rock. Pressure and heat changed some of this carbon and hydrogen-rich material into coal, some into oil (petroleum) and some into natural gas. Natural gas should not be confused with gasoline, which is a petroleum product. Natural gas from underground reservoirs is a nonrenewable energy source, which means we cannot make more in a short time.

In some places, natural gas moved into large cracks and spaces between layers of overlying rock. The natural gas found in these types of formations is called conventional natural gas. In other places, natural gas occurs in the tiny pores (spaces) within some formations of shale, sandstone, and other types of sedimentary rock. This natural gas is referred to as shale gas or tight gas, and it is sometimes called unconventional natural gas. Natural gas also occurs with deposits of crude oil, and this natural gas is called associated natural gas. Natural gas deposits are found on land and some are offshore and deep under the ocean floor. Coalbed Methane is a type of natural gas found in coal deposits.

Natural gas production, transportation, distribution, and storage require strict safety regulations and standards. Because a natural gas leak could cause an explosion, strict government regulations and industry standards are in place to ensure the safe transportation, storage, distribution, and use of natural gas. Because processed natural gas has no odor, natural gas companies add a strong, rotten egg-like smelling substance called mercaptan to natural gas so that people can smell leaks.

SOME ADDC FIRSTS

The first Club Meeting was held on March 1949 in New Orleans, Louisiana by Inez Awtry Shaeffer.

The first Articles of Association were signed on July 23, **1951**.

In **1952** Inez Awtry Shaeffer was presented with an ADDC Honorary Member. There have only been two presented in ADDC history, the second being Lee Wilson Hoover in 1954.

The first ADDC President was Lee Wilson Hoover elected in **1952**.

The first Convention was held in **1952** at the Shamrock Hotel in Houston, Texas. Forty clubs were represented with 994 registrants.

The first Oil and Gal Journal was published in **1952**. It was named by Josephine Nolen of Odessa, Texas, who won the contest for its name.

The first International Convention was in held September **1954** at the Banff Springs Hotel in Banff, Alberta, Canada.

The AIMEE (Achievement in Maintaining Energy Excellence) was first established in **1977**. The two levels are the Regional Award of Merit (Region Winners) and the Association's Award of Excellence (International Winners).

The first Desk and Derrick Journal was published in **1987**. It replaced the Oil and Gal Journal.

Membership first opened to men in 1988.

In **2002** the curriculum was established for a Certification Program, the Petroleum Tech Certificate of Completion, to be given at the annual ADDC Convention.

In **2008**, the first Petroleum Tech Certificate of Completion was awarded; there were seven people who received this certification.

The first ADDC Insight replaced the Desk and Derrick Journal in **2014**. Helen Trujillo, of the Club of Farmington, was the original editor. The Insight is a link between Club members and ADDC, and is only available online.

Membership first opened to people not employed with an energy industry business in 2015.
