



MONTHLY PROGRAM ARTICLE

March Program Written by Marnee Lane Speaker: Maurice Nassar Title: Bridging the Gap with Younger (and Older) Generations

The generation gap is nothing but the differences between the beliefs of the older and the young. There are a lot of misconceptions about how different generations work with each other. The fact is younger generations continue to enter the workforce and rise to positions of increasing responsibility, and older generations are remaining in the workforce. This means getting past the misconceptions and bridging these gaps is becoming increasingly important.

Maurice's discussion focused on ways different generations think, how generations can find common ground, and how they can turn different perspectives into team approaches to help their organizations succeed.

There are several different ways generations think. For example, technology is one way. The younger generation has exposure due to technology that the older generation did not even conceive. They have any information they want to see at their fingertips. So, obviously, younger people have very little patience in comparison to the older generation. In the past, social media was not there; therefore, the older generation lived in a different social manner. The older generation lived in such conditions as sensitivity to religions, where government jobs were highly prized, where you retired from the company you worked for, and at a time when career options were few. The older generation have faced many more situations than the younger generation, so part of their "education" is life experiences.

The keys to bridge the generation gap are communication, understanding of the different situations, acceptance of those differences, and finding a middle ground by both parts.






