Title: What's Oil Got to Do with it?

Many are now watching the Permian Basin. The PB is in a dilemma, whether or not to release more drilling rigs. Suppliers are cautious about how much more to add.

There are problems the PB is facing. Due to the pandemic, many field workers have either retired or taken more stable jobs. Due to the pandemic, equipment production slowed down, and equipment is no longer readily available. In recent years, Wall Street has labeled the O&G industry as a risky investment. The decisions of the US administration had negative consequences on the O&G industry. Currently, the war that Russia is involved in results in an uncertain future on the global market. Saudi Arabia could start flooding the market with supplies.

However, the Permian Basin has some great advantages. The shale revolution allowed the Permian Basin to become the world's biggest oil producer. Traffic in this area is increasing. New investments are being made. Since the pandemic, things have stayed depressed in the Bakken, Eagle Ford and Woodford. Those regions are expected to either flat line or show very little uptick this year.

So it comes down to the Permian Basin. It seems like the Permian Basin could become the world's most important growth engine for oil production.

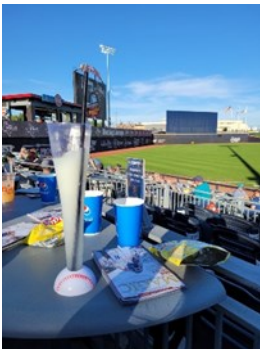


Then back on the road I went...

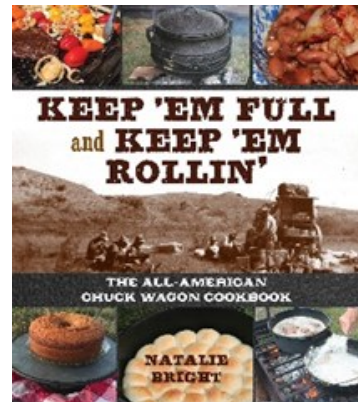
Saturday, May 7, 2022:

PROS AND CONS WIND

energy4me.org

Wind is a form of solar energy. The sun's radiation heats different parts of the Earth at different rates-most notably during the day and night-influenced by the shape of the planet's terrain, bodies of water, and vegetation. Hot air rises, reducing the atmospheric pressure at the Earth's surface, and cooler air draws in to replace it. The result is wind.

PROS:

- No emissions
- Renewable
- Affordable
- Little disruption of ecosystems
- Relatively high output
- Profitable for landowners

CONS:

- Output is proportional to wind speed
- Not feasible for all geographic locations
- High initial and ongoing costs
- Extensive land use
- Threat to wildlife
- Noise and visual pollution

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT:

Wind is a clean energy source. It produces no air or water pollution because it does not burn fuel to generate electricity. The most serious environmental impact from wind energy may be its effect on bird and bat mortality. Wind turbine design has changed dramatically in the last couple of decades to reduce this impact. Turbine blades are now solid, so there are no lattice structures that entice birds to perch. In addition, the blades' surface area is much larger, so they do not have to spin as fast to generate power. Slower-moving blades mean fewer bird collisions.

Wind power plants create little disruption to local ecosystems. Utility-scale wind power plants built on open terrain require about 60 acres per megawatt of installed capacity. But, according to the American Wind Energy Association, only about 5% of this area is needed for the actual turbines and other equipment. The rest of the land can be used for other purposes like farming and ranching.

Happy June!

Over the last couple of years, it seems our organization has been hit with some pretty hefty fines when it comes to copyright infringement of photo's.

In copyright law, there are a lot of different types of works, including paintings, photographs, illustrations, musical compositions, sound recordings, computer programs, books, poems, blog posts, movies, architectural works, plays, and so much more!

An example of the issue at hand is folks are copying pictures found on the internet and using them in newsletters, social media, etc. Unless you have purchased the copyright license or received direct approval from the owner this is copyright infringement and can be subject to hefty fines.

Is it possible to use a copyright-protected work without infringing?

Yes, in some circumstances, it is possible to use a copyright-protected work without infringing the owner's copyright. For more about this, you may wish to learn about fair use. It is important to note that your content can be removed in response to a claim of copyright infringement, even if you have...

- Given credit to the copyright owner
- Refrained from monetizing the infringing content
- Charged for a copy of the content in question
- Noticed similar content that appear elsewhere on the internet
- Purchased the content including a hard or digital copy
- Recorded the content yourself from TV, a movie theater, or the radio
- Copied the content yourself from a textbook, a movie poster or photograph
- Stated that "no copyright infringement is intended"

The best rule of thumb is to only use photos you have received direct permission to use or have purchased the license to use it. 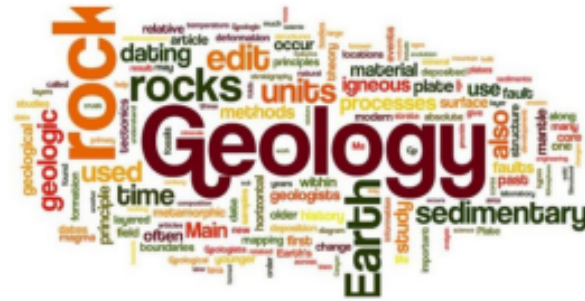

The purpose of the ADDC Certification Program is to provide an educational program covering the subjects within the established curriculum.

Natural resources are the backbone of both renewable and non-renewable energy production. This course will introduce you to the many natural resources that are used today for energy production including coal, oil, gas, uranium, solar, wind, geothermal, hydropower and biomass resources. Topics will include where are these resources located, how are they extracted or collected for use, and what is their abundance and availability for energy production.



The first track in the new ADDC Certification program will be focused on geology. How is geology important for our energy resources? Coal, oil, and natural gas are formed by geological processes over millions of years. What is geology? How does it apply to not just fossil fuels but renewables as well?

FLIGHT 93 NATIONAL MEMORIAL

Of the four aircraft hijacked, Tuesday morning, September 11, 2001, United Airlines Flight 93 is the only one that did not reach the hijackers' intended target, which was presumed to be the United States Capitol in Washington, D.C. Several passengers and crew members made cellular telephone calls from the plane and learned about the attacks on the World Trade Center and the Pentagon. As a result, the passengers and crew members decided to mount an assault in order to retake control of the aircraft. The plane crashed in a field in Stonycreek Township about 150 miles (240 kilometers) northwest of Washington, D.C., killing all 44 passengers and crew members, including the four terrorists.



The story of Flight 93 is a story of hope, courage, and unity. When confronted with the urgency of their situation, the passengers and crew of Flight 93 chose to act heroically and made the ultimate sacrifice for their country. Because of the actions of the 40 passengers and crew aboard Flight 93, the attack on the U.S. Capitol was thwarted.

Established in September 2002, the Flight 93 National Memorial is a serene place of remembrance and honor. At the Memorial, you can walk beside the 40 passengers and crew of Flight 93's final resting place and honor their courage. Whether your visit serves as a pilgrimage, a patriotic rite of passage or a historical and educational experience, one thing is for certain, the Flight 93 National Memorial is incredibly thought-provoking and emotionally powerful.

QUECREEK MINE RESCUE SITE



The Quecreek Mine rescue took place in Somerset County, PA, when nine miners were trapped underground for over 77 hours, from July 24-28, 2002. The ensuing five-day rescue effort and miraculous rescue of all nine miners is the stuff of dreams and legend. Few events have caught the world's attention and emotion and ended with such a positive uplifting finale.

2022 marks the 20 year Anniversary of the rescue. We invite you to come visit the rescue site where you can walk right up to the rescue shaft where the miners emerged from the dark cold mine 240 feet below. Hear the story of the miracle rescue. Touch the rescue capsule and try to imagine how it would feel to squeeze into it with your strength nearly gone.

The Quecreek Mine Rescue Memorial – Monument for Life honors and portrays the team of rescue workers who saved the nine trapped coal miners from certain death. In a larger sense, the memorial site honors the tireless heroism of rescue workers everywhere, as well as serve as a lasting tribute to the coal miners of Southwestern PA and across the nations. In addition, the site will provide a variety of educational experiences for visitors.

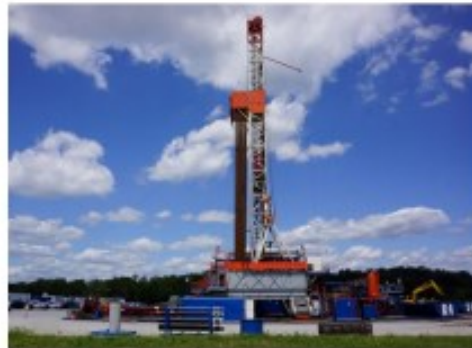
