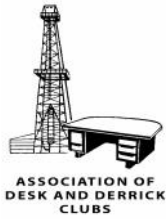

## **WHAT DESK AND DERRICK MEANS TO ME**

Red River Desk and Derrick Club's October meeting will be based on the topic ***WHAT PETROLEUM MEANS TO ME***, and the Essay Contest has been prepared for school students on the same topic. So, I thought, why not have an article on ***"What Desk and Derrick Means to me."*** Here goes.

I started my career in the Petroleum industry in 1957 but was not introduced to Desk and Derrick until 1969. I had met Betty Peeler (Ross) while working for Placid Oil Company in 1961. I worked in the Division Order department and Betty was in the department handling production reports. We would see each other usually in the elevator lobby at the end of our workday. The guys were always teasing Betty and they always get a smashing retort.

One day my department manager called me into his office and told me that our company was moving to Dallas in November 1962. I had only a month's notice to sell my house, find an apartment in Dallas and make arrangements for a caretaker for my 5-year-old son. That really put pressure on me to get all that done in a short period of time.

One day I was working during the lunch hour and Betty Peeler(Ross) walked into my office and said to me, "I feel like you are having some deep problems right now, and I don't know if I can help you or if you want to tell me to mind my own business, but if there is anything I can do for you let me know", and I started crying. I told her that my house had sold, I had not been able to find an apartment in Dallas yet, and I was going to have to leave my son with my mother and father for a while.

Betty immediately said that I could move my furniture into her garage and stay with her until I got everything arranged for my move to Dallas. **A lady with a heart of gold.** I did move in with her, sold my furniture, and took my son down to stay with mom and dad. I made one trip to Dallas and found an apartment with another lady who worked with me in the Division Order Department. The job with Placid in Dallas just did not work as I thought and in 1963, I moved back to Shreveport, AGAIN to live with Betty for a brief period.

I started working for Western Electric Company in the accounting department and was not happy with that job. Betty called me one day at work and told me she knew of a job with a small petroleum company in the land department if I wanted it. I arranged a quick interview with the president of the company and was hired on the spot. I was with that company for about 12 years when the management of the company made a major change in management, and my job was gone.

Sometime in 1969 Betty started talking to me about an organization named ***Shreveport Desk and Derrick Club***. She convinced me that it was a great educational group of ladies who all worked in the petroleum industry. With Monthly meetings with a speaker who informed the ladies about all phases of the petroleum industry. Betty finally convinced me that I should join, and I did.

And did I ever learn about the petroleum industry. Being what goes on when they are drilling a well, what happens to the production from the wells, what state departments controlled the industry, what was a "workover", what happens when a well is "plugged", and on and on everything pertaining to an oil and gas company.

I learned more about the petroleum industry through those monthly meetings, the "field trips" we made to drilling rigs, refineries, pipeline compressor facilities, digging for diamonds and other minerals in Arkansas. For years after attending the annual Convention we were able to take guided trips to Canada, France, Germany, England and sailing trips up the coast of Alaska. Regional meetings took us all over the South.

As to the jobs I held early in my career, when taking a drilling report one morning the roughneck told me they “had lost Kelly in the hole”, and I almost screamed out “what do you mean you lost Kelly in the hole, that poor man, how on earth are you going to get him out?” He laughed and said they had called for the fishing gear, to which I exclaimed “how on earth can you get him out with just fishing line” to which he explained to me that a kelly is a tool that had dropped off the rigging and the fishing gear was another that would grasp on to the Kelly and bring it back out of the hole. **WHEW!!**

In November 1981, Betty Ross decided that we needed another Desk and Derrick Club in Shreveport, and she gathered a group who agreed, so in ***March 1982 Red River Desk and Derrick Club*** was Chartered. I have happily served in many positions with Red River. Without Desk and Derrick, I would not have been able to understand enough about the industry to earn my living for over 50 years. I could handle any job thrown at me in the industry. Division Order Analyst, Accountant, Independent Petroleum Landman, and Land Department Manager. I knew enough of all of it to stay employed in any position that was open. I learned you had to be able to change jobs, change companies, change the city where I worked and lived. The old saying is “You gotta be able to go where the work is”. I moved - Beaumont Texas, to Shreveport, Louisiana, to Dallas Texas, back to Shreveport, then to Houston Texas and FINALLY back to Shreveport. Now, at the age of 90 I can't say I am enjoying retirement; NO, I miss going into the most interesting job in the world, any position in the PETROLEUM INDUSTRY. And remember, I was able to do that through my association with Desk and Derrick. That's ***What Desk and Derrick Means to me***. It provided me with education to know ***What the Petroleum Industry Means to me***.

And from that beginning in Desk and Derrick I learned so very much about the petroleum industry. Each month's speaker taught us something new. I got to know *What Desk and Derrick and the Petroleum Industry*, means to me. Yes, through all those meetings and through all the field trips to everything pertaining to the petroleum industry, learned *What Desk and Derrick Means to Me, AND What the Petroleum industry means to me*.

Another big plus about Desk and Derrick was the many friends I made from all over the United States and especially those in Shreveport who are still with me. I only hope that the members of ALL Desk and Derrick Clubs have gained as much knowledge, friends, and experiences as I have. All members will need to do as Betty Ross did and contact every petroleum employee, male or female, particularly working in the offices, and encourage them to become a member of Desk and Derrick. It will prove rewarding to each as it has for me.
