

2023 OUIZ BOWL

In recognition of March being designated Desk and Derrick Awareness Month, President Bonnie Fish, with the assistance of Bobbie Trust (proofreader & moderator), Margie Steed (proofreader, tall tale teller and scorekeeper) and Dorothy Semon (proofreader & judge), prepared a program entitled "RRDD QUIZ BOWL – 2023". Members and advisors were divided into 2 teams, and, using a buzzer system loaned to them by a local school) they competed in answering 10 tossup questions in each of 4 quarters. Rules for the competition are as follows:

DESK & DERRICK QUIZ BOWL

- 1. MEMBERS IN ATTENDANCE WILL BE DIVIDED INTO TWO TEAMS.
- 2. EACH TEAM SHALL SELECT A CAPTAIN AND 3 MEMBERS AS THEIR INITIAL COMPETING TEAM.
- 3. SUBSTITUTIONS FROM THE REMAINING TEAM MEMBERS SHALL BE MADE AT THE END OF QUARTERS. WE WANT ALL MEMBERS TO HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO COMPETE SO TEAMS, PLEASE CALCULATE WHAT AND HOW MANY SUBSTITUTIONS YOU NEED TO MAKE IN ORDER TO MAKE SURE WE ALL PLAY.
- 4. THE GAME WILL CONSIST OF 10 TOSS-UP QUESTIONS IN EACH OF THE FOLLOWING CATEGORIES. POINT VALUE FOR EACH QUESTION WILL BE ANNOUNCED BY THE MODERATOR WHEN READING THE QUESTION. PARTIAL ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS RE-OUIRING MULTIPLE RESPONSES WILL BE 5 POINTS.
 - (A) ADDC HISTORY
 - (B) REGION HISTORY
 - (C) CLUB HISTORY
 - (D) MISCELLANEOUS ADDC HISTORY
- 5. ANY OF THE 4 TEAM MEMBERS CURRENTLY COMPETING MAY BUZZ IN AT ANY TIME WHILE THE QUESTION IS BEING READ, AND ONCE RECOGNIZED BY THE MODERATOR, ANSWER THE QUESTION. REMEMBER WHEN YOU BUZZ IN, WAIT UNTIL THE MODERATOR ANNOUNCES YOUR NAME AND TEAM BEFORE ANSWERING.
- 6. IF THE ANSWER IS INCORRECT, ANY MEMBER OF THE COMPETING TEAM MAY BUZZ IN, AND AFTER BEING RECOGNIZED BY THE MODERATOR, ANSWER.
- 7. IF BOTH TEAMS ANSWER INCORRECTLY, THE QUESTION WILL BE TOSSED, AND A NEW QUESTION PRESENTED.
- 8. THERE WILL BE NO SUBTRACTION OF POINTS FOR INCORRECT ANSWERS.
- 9. QUESTIONS REQUIRING A PERSON'S NAME MAY BE ANSWERED USING THE PERSON'S LAST NAME ONLY.
- 10. ANY ANSWERS CALLED OUT FROM THE AUDIENCE WILL RESULT IN THE QUESTION BEING TOSSED. ANY MEMBER NOT CURRENTLY ON THE COMPETING TEAM WHO CALLS OUT FROM THE AUDIENCE WILL WEAR A DUNCE CAP FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE QUARTER.






