

An Overview of the Industry

Forthcoming, Robert Stroud let us know that he tends to "cram" before the big event! We didn't have a defined topic from our speaker prior to our meeting, but nonetheless his cramming proved no doubt that he knew his topic. The topic becoming An Overview of the Industry. And once again, Robert served the industry and his audience with optimism and light hearted humor, two traits required to be in this industry as long she has.

With all the negativity spewing at our oil and gas industry today, this listener in particular loved hearing of its beginnings and continued benefits. Starting in 400 BC (!) Robert shared how we relied on fossil fuels where Chinese accidentally encountered oil and gas seeping from the ground and actually traversed the product through bamboo. Throughout the years oil was used for heating and lighting, in additional to medicinal purposes.

The mid 1800's brought shallow drilling from individuals and soon thereafter, small syndicates. As knowledge of the product's benefits grew, so did education of how to produce. Auger bits and cable tools were just beginning to retrieve the product. The mid 1800's developed products like plastics, fertilizers and more medicines making the production of fossil fuels more desirous. And in 1859 in the town of Titusville, the first production well was drilled in the United States. Towards the late 1800's, geological studies became increasingly valuable with small corporations and trusts forming to pool resources for investing in production. One interesting note made by Robert: the industry was "green" before "green" was a thing. The production of oil from the lands meant less killing of whales!

The early 1900's were similar but adding seismic studies, rotary bits and electric well-logging. Still, the players were individuals and syndicates with companies forming from investors. In 1901, the modern oil industry was created with the discovery of oil in Beaumont, Texas known as Spindletop. In 1938, Caddo Lake was actually considered the first offshore drilling rig because it did not have a pier connecting to land. The mid to later years of the 1900's saw larger companies form, the education of tools for drilling, 3D seismic procedures and bumper stickers stating "if you don't have a well, get one"!

Robert touched on current events and attitudes. As we are all very much aware, the public has forgotten the history, the purpose and the need but being an eternal optimist with his glass overflowing, Robert states his belief that our industry will prevail because there is no product like it and no replacement that covers the magnitude of benefits as fossil fuels.

And for this listener, the best comment anyone could have added was when Robert, having been an advisor since 2005, shared the value he has seen over the years coming from Desk and Derrick and its

origin and purpose of educating.




