# Oil Edges Higher on Supply Tightness, China Demand Hopes

HOUSTON (Reuters) -Oil prices edged slightly higher on Monday, bouncing back from early losses, as top oil executives at an energy conference in Houston discussed supply tightness and hopes for rising Chinese demand.

Oil market and logistics are tight and vulnerable to any unexpected supply disruption, as Russian oil is still getting to the market, but at different costs, oil major Chevron Corp Chief Executive Mike Wirth said at the CERAWeek energy conference.

Trading company Gunvor's CEO Torbjorn Tornqvist said crude prices may rise in the second half of the year as Chinese demand returns to the market, adding that the oil market has stabilized.

Brent crude futures were trading up 35 cents, or 0.4% at \$86.18 a barrel, while U.S. West Texas Intermediate (WTI) crude futures were up 78 cents, or 1%, at \$80.46. Oil was also supported by top crude exporter Saudi Arabia raising prices for the flagship Arab light crude it sells to Asia for a second month in April, as well as a weaker dollar.

A weaker greenback makes dollar-denominated crude cheaper for foreign buyers and boosts demand.

Earlier in the session, both benchmarks had decline by more than \$1 per barrel after China on Sunday set a lower-than-expected 5% gross domestic product (GDP) growth target for this year, down from last year's 5.5% target. Policy sources had told Reuters the target could be set as high as 6% for 2023.

China's GDP grew last year by only 3%. Premier Li Keqiang on Sunday said the foundation for stable growth needed to be consolidated, that insufficient demand remained a pronounced problem and expectations of private investors and businesses were unstable.

Oil traders are also concerned about interest rates across the world as global central banks have been tighteneing policy to fight inflation.

Investors awaited U.S. Federal Reserve Chair Jerome Powell's testimony this week. Traders have started factoring in rate hikes but are hoping for smaller increases than last year.

The Fed's Powell will testify to Congress on Tuesday and Wednesday, when he is likely to be quizzed on whether larger increases are needed in the world's biggest consuming country.

Future U.S. rate hikes are also likely to depend on what the February payrolls report reveals on Friday, followed by the February inflation report next week.

Over the weekend, European Central Bank President Christine Lagarde said it was "very likely" the bank would raise interest rates this month to keep a lid on inflation. A Miami native, Briggs began his five-decade oil and gas career with Owen Drilling Company while he was still attending the ULL, then known as the University of Southwestern Louisiana. He graduated in 1964 and eventually formed Aztec Corp., a pipe supply company. In October 1992, he left his private sector business to form LOGA, which originally was known as the Louisiana Independent Oil and Gas Association. The group represents independent oil and gas companies at the state and federal levels. Briggs led LOGA from its founding until 2018. His son, Gifford, took the reins for the next two years. Gifford Briggs said he was lucky to work with his father for 14 years at LOGA, learning the ins and outs of Louisiana's sprawling oil and gas industry. "I got to see firsthand just what an amazing individual he was," Gifford Briggs said.

Chris John, a past president of the Louisiana Mid-Continent Oil and Gas Association and former state lawmaker and congressman, saw Briggs lobby both at the State Capitol and the halls of Congress. "He was a tireless, tenacious, unapologetic advocate for the oil and gas industry, John said "Briggs had an uncanny ability to connect with people at all levels in the industry, from field workers to CEOs, said Bryan Hanks, president and CEO of Beta Land Services in Lafayette and a former LOGA chairman. "He truly was very unique in that perspective, having the ability to do that, and at the same time he was a fierce competitor," Hanks said. Hanks first met Briggs in the early 1990s, when LOGA was just getting off the ground. "He actually, for whatever reason, took me under his wing and told me he would not let me make the mistakes that he made as I was progressing in my career and building a company," Hanks said. "That was really a great benefit to me."

David Dismukes, who stepped down as executive director of LSU's Center for Energy Studies earlier this year, said Briggs offered advice on anything ranging from oil and gas tax policy to who to meet in the industry. He said Briggs understood the plight of independent oil companies following the 1980s oil crash. "He was always somebody that I could count on, particularly early in my career," Dismukes said.

Briggs lived in Lafayette for more than four decades. He was so beloved in the area that some restaurants named dishes after him, John said. "You could go to La Fonda and you could get your steak Don Briggs style," John said.

A few years after stepping down as LOGA's president, Briggs that recounted his life and career. Though he found many highs, he endured several lows as well. A 2016 fall led to serious head injuries that left his life in the balance. "In typical Don Briggs fashion he came back and wasn't going to let that stop him," John said.

But in 2021, an I-12 accident killed his wife, Nannette, and left Briggs with injuries.

Briggs served on the boards of a host of industry groups and committees, including the Louisiana Association of Business and Industry, the Independent Petroleum Association of America and the Lafayette Chamber of Commerce, among many others.

Tommy Faucheux, president of the Louisiana Mid-Continent Oil and Gas Association, said the state's oil and gas industry lost a "great leader" and "loyal friend."

"He had a tremendous impact on Louisiana's energy industry and all who had the honor of working with him," Faucheux said in a statement.

Don was a proud and loyal supporter of Desk and Derrick. He will be missed by all.

# **Simply the Best Deviled Eggs**

This is my favorite deviled eggs recipe. Its simplicity makes it so good.

Prep Time: 10 mins Cook Time: 5 mins

Additional Time: 15 mins
Total Time: 30 mins

# **Ingredients**

- 15 jumbo eggs
- 3/4 cup cooked and chopped bacon,
- divided 1/3 cup minced onion
- 3 tablespoons dill pickle relish
- 3 tablespoons mayonnaise
- 2 teaspoons prepared yellow mustard
- 2 teaspoons bacon drippings
- 1 pinch salt and ground black pepper
- 1 teaspoon paprika

# **Directions**

# Step 1

Place eggs in a saucepan and cover with water. Bring to a boil; remove from heat and let eggs stand in hot water for 15 minutes.

Remove eggs from hot water. Cool under cold running water; peel eggs. Slice each egg in half lengthwise. Place yolks in a small bowl.

# Step 2

Mix 1/2 cup bacon, onion, dill pickle relish, mayonnaise, mustard, and bacon grease with the egg yolks using a fork; keep the yolks chunky. Stir in salt and black pepper.

# Step 3

Scoop yolk mixture into 24 of the egg white halves. Sprinkle paprika and remaining 1/4 cup bacon on top.

# Cook's Notes:

You can play with the amount of mayonnaise, mustard, onion, and dill relish to adjust the flavor. The key is to not make the filling too soupy with too much mayonnaise.

Chop the onion as finely as possible to avoid overwhelming the dish.


