

Our Tuesday night meeting began with the reminder - technology is not always our friend. Mike and Mark Mangum arrived early to set up the video showing photos from around Shreveport called "Shreveport Then and Now". Unfortunately as plans go this one was on the verge of going array when they were informed that we understood things don't always go as planned and we were confident that their presentation would be fine.



A bit of history: Mike and Mark Mangham (twin brothers) grew up in the Southern Hills area of Shreveport. They graduated from Woodlawn High School and Centenary College. After college Mark played four years in the minor leagues as a knuckleball pitcher (two years with the Houston Astros and two years with the Saint Louis Cardinals). From playing recreational sports in their younger years, they now spend time together working on Twin Blends. They can often be found hunting for civil war relics with the curator of the Spring Street Museum Marty Lawson. Initially they started off calling themselves "Twin Blends Photography" where they would take images from the Northwest Louisiana Archives at LSUS, they would then add color and combine the early snapshots

with their own modern photos, the result is a wonderful mashup of old and new images. But recently they have dropped the photography part and changed the name to "Twin Blends Northwest Louisiana History Hunters" because it better explains what they do. They aren't professional photographers, but they use photography as one of the many tools to help tell the history of this area in a fun and exciting way.




