BASICS OF THE LOUISIANA MINERAL SERVITUDE

Ownership of land does not include ownership of oil, gas, and other minerals occurring naturally in liquid or gaseous form. The landowner has the exclusive right to explore and develop his property for the production of such minerals and to reduce them to possession and ownership. A landowner may convey, reserve, or lease this right. If a landowner conveys or reserves this right, he has created a mineral servitude. A mineral servitude is the right of enjoyment of land belonging to another for the purpose of exploring for and producing minerals and reducing them to possession and ownership.

A single mineral servitude may not be created on two or more noncontiguous tracts of land. A single mineral servitude is created by an act that affects a continuous body of land although individual tracts or parcels within the whole are separately described. An act creating mineral servitudes on noncontiguous tracts of land creates as many mineral servitudes as there are tracts unless the act provides for more. Under Louisiana jurisprudence, two tracts of land which touch only at the corners (corner to corner) are not contiguous.

A mineral servitude is extinguished by: Prescription resulting from nonuse for ten years; confusion; renunciation of the servitude on the part of him to whom it is due, or the express remission of his right; expiration of the time for which the servitude was granted, or the happening of the dissolving condition attached to the servitude; or extinction of the right of him who established the servitude.

Prescription of nonuse of a mineral servitude commences from the date on which it is created. There are several ways to interrupt the prescription of nonuse running against a mineral servitude. For example, prescription may be interrupted by:

- Good faith operations for the discovery and production of minerals (by good faith it is meant that the operations must be: Commenced with reasonable expectation of discovering and producing minerals in paying quantities at a particular point or depth, continued at the site chosen to that point or depth, and conducted in such a manner that they constitute a single operation although actual drilling or mining is not conducted at all times);
- A good faith attempt to complete a well or place it in production;
- Certain testing of a shut-in well (as qualified by the law)
- Unitization with a tested shut-in well (as described by the law)
- Production of any mineral covered by the act creating the servitude (the production does not have to be in paying quantities; it is necessary only that minerals actually be produced in good faith with the intent of saving or otherwise using them for some beneficial purpose);
- Production from a conventional or compulsory unit embracing all or part of the tract burdened by a mineral servitude (the production does not have to be in paying quantities; see above);
- Good faith operations to restore production or to secure new production;
- Acknowledgment by the owner of the land burdened by the mineral servitude (must strictly follow the required formalities);

[Summary of Certain Main Points in Speech to Red River Desk and Derrick Club –
February 26, 2024] continued

- Contractual extension for a period less than that which would result from an interruption by an acknowledgment (must strictly follow the required formalities).

The law provides for the date on which prescription is interrupted, and the date on which prescription begins to run again, in different situations. For example, and generally speaking, interruption takes place on the date actual drilling or other operations, production, etc., commence, and prescription begins to run anew from the last day on which actual drilling or other operations are conducted, or from the date of cessation of actual production, as the case may be.

An operation, production, etc., on the servitude tract interrupts prescription as to the entire servitude tract. If only a portion of the land burdened by a mineral servitude is included within a conventional or compulsory unit, and the operation, production, etc., is not located on the servitude tract, the interruption of prescription extends to only that portion of the servitude tract included in the unit.

With some exceptions, use of a mineral servitude must be by the owner of the servitude, his representative, or employee, or some other person acting on his behalf.

Parties may either fix the term of a mineral servitude or shorten the applicable period of prescription of nonuse or both. If a period of prescription greater than ten years is stipulated, the period is reduced by operation of law to ten years.

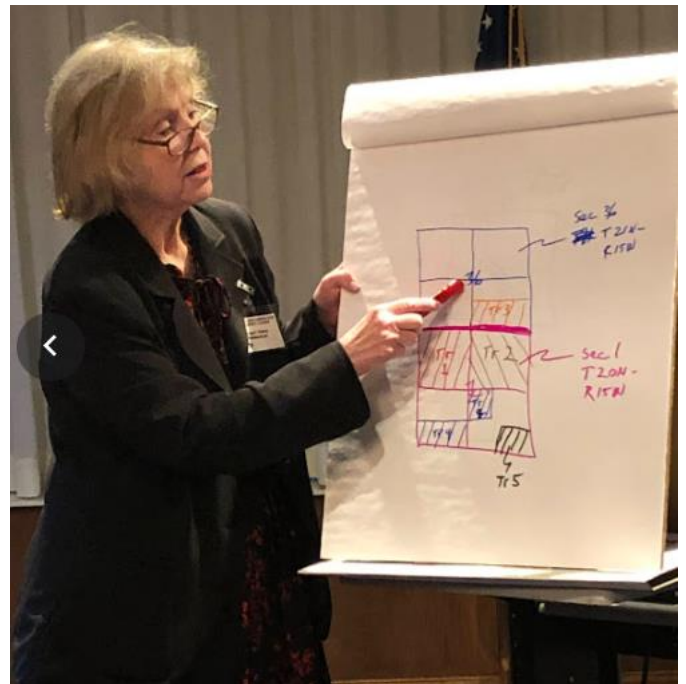
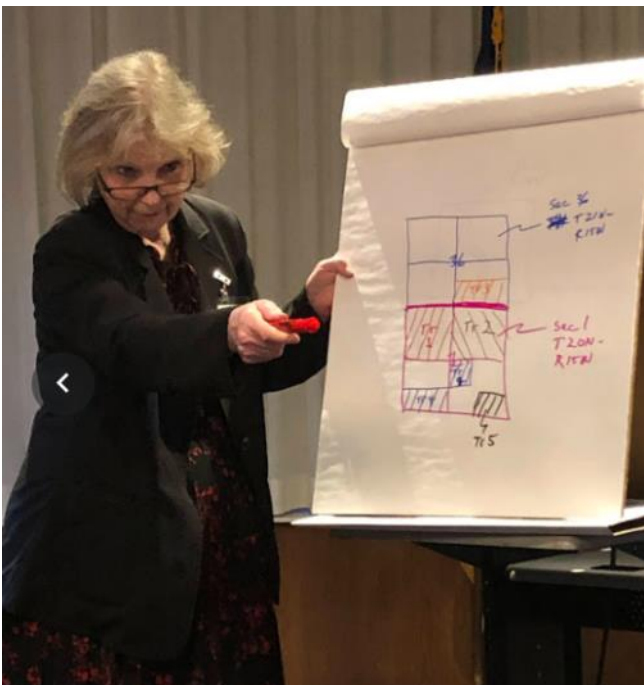
The expectancy of a landowner in the extinction of an outstanding mineral servitude cannot be conveyed or reserved directly or indirectly.

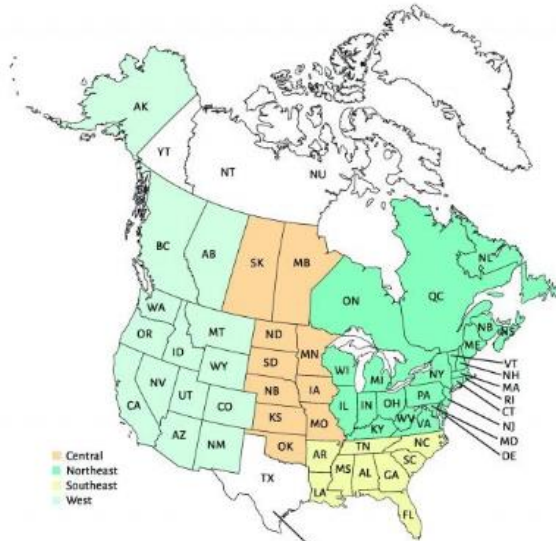

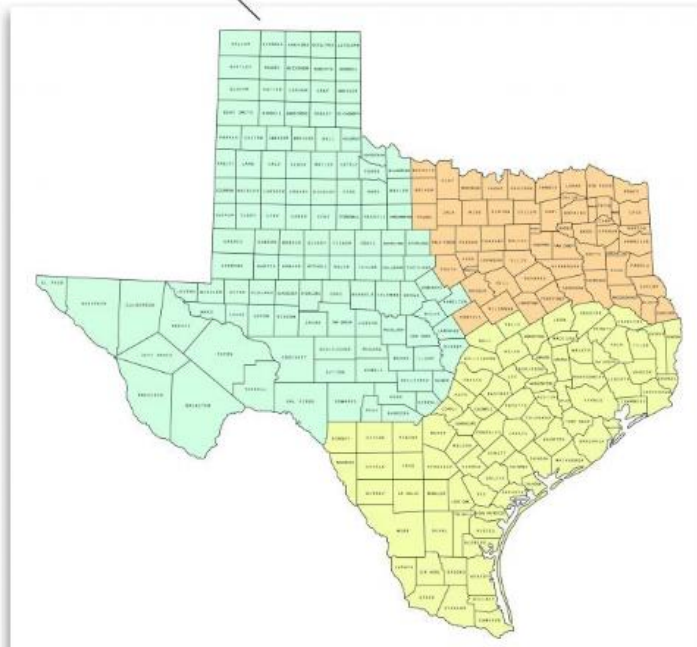
